

Provided nevertheless that in case of the death of any of my younger Sons before he comes intitled to receive his share and dividend of my Estate and after the Eldest son or Eldest sons shall have received his or their share and dividend thereof yet such Eldest son or Eldest sons shall be intitled to and take with my other Youngen Surviving Sons or Son a share of the Estate by this my will given, or intended to be given or bequeathed to such younger Sons or son dying as aforesaid And my will is that my said Executors or if survivors or survivor of them shall have full power and authority in making the Divisions & allotments aforesaid in case they or the Survivors or survivor of them see fit to proportion the Personal with the real Estate each son is to have so that the whole share of each son may as near as may be, be equal in real value & price if not in quantity or kind And I do hereby confirm & establish to my said Sons respectively and their respective Heirs, Executors Administrators and Assigns upon the Conditions & contingencies herein before mentioned The Estate Real & Personal to be allotted and Divided to each of them as aforesaid. Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and Appoint John Gordon of Savannah in Georgia Esq.<sup>r</sup> George Sommers Henry Lawrence and James Parsons of Charles Town Esq.<sup>rs</sup> and Edward Newfrie of the same place Merchants and the Survivors or Survivor of them Executors and Executor of this my last Will and Testament and and Guardian and Guardian of the Persons and Estates of my Children respectively until they shall respectively become intitled to the Estate or legacy hereby devised or bequeathed to them respectively.

And lastly I do hereby make and ordain John Brauld of Charles Town Gentleman Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former and other wills by me at any time heretofore made ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I the said Sarah Smith have hereunto set my Hand & seal

The remaining part to be equally divided between the issue of my deceased Brother Jno. Field also the issue of My sister Deborah Smith & the son of my brother William Field their names as follows, Viz. Elizabeth Field, Mias Nichols, Mergia Field, Mias Scott, Charles Smith, Elizabeth Smith and John Cato Field, each and every to partake of an equal division And lastly I appoint & constitute my well beloved Brother William Field whole and sole Executor to this my Last Will & Testament In Witness hereof I set my hand and seal this 8 day of December An: Dom: 1762

Item I give to Catherine Snell my well beloved Daughter all my stock of Neat Cattle branded as KS Thus and to her heirs lawfully begotten of her body but in case my said Daughter Catherine dies before she comes to the age of eighteen or without heirs lawfully begotten of her body then all the stock of Neat Cattle above mentioned shall fall to my son Adams children to be equally divided amongst them Item I further give my said Daughter Catherine one bay mare with a bald face branded
