South Carolina In the name of God amen I Thomas Clifford of St.  
 Bartholomews Parish Colleton County Province of South Carolina being weak of  
 body but of sound & perfect memory & mind thro' the mercy of God do make &  
 Publish this my Last Will & Testament in manner & form following First  
 & principally I resign my soul into the hands of Almighty God my Creator  
 Hoping for a Blessed Immortality thro' the merits & Mediation of Jesus  
 Christ my Saviour & Redeemer, and my body I desire may be decently  
 Buried in a Christian manner & in regard to my worldly Estate I give  
 & bequeath my real estate between my beloved sons Thomas & Charles  
 Clifford to be equally divided between them and as to my personal estate  
 I leave it to be equally divided between my dear & beloved wife Elizabeth  
 and my four children vizt. Thomas Charles, James & Elizabeth share  
 & have a like each or either of my children to have their part when at  
 the age of Twenty one years or at the Day of Marriage I likewise leave  
 to my beloved wife Elizabeth the use of the plantation whereon I now  
 live during her life, and she to have the disposal of her proportional part  
 of my personal estate, and to leave it at her death either between my  
 four children above mentioned or to either of them she pleases, I likewise  
 give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary Sachinereil the  
 full and just sum of Five hundred pound Currency to be payed as soon  
 as convenient for the plantation likewise I give & bequeath to my  
 beloved daughter Sarah Yonge the full & just sum of Five hundred  
 pounds Currency to be payed as soon as convenient for the plantation.  
 And of this my Last Will & Testament, I make & ordain my  
 dear beloved wife Elizabeth & my son Thomas & also my Son in Law  
 Francis Yonge my full and lawful Exors & hereby revoke and  
 annul all and every other will or Testament by me in any wise  
 before this time made - In Witness whereof I have set my hand  
 and seal this Second day of March in the year of our Lord 1762

Note after signing the above will I Thomas Clifford do in presence of these Witnesses do hereby will & direct that my Exors above mentioned shall & will at all times after my lawful & just debts & the legacies above mentioned to my Daughters Mary Sachineral & Sarah Yonge are satisfied at their own discretion put out to use all such sum or sums of money over & above what is sufficient & necessary for the maintaining my family & educating my children as shall arise from or be made of the profits of my said Estate, or the same moneys to be made as aforesaid, to be laid out in the purchase of lands & young Slaves & I do hereby devise & Bequeath that all such moneys so put out at use & the Interest arising thereon & all & singular the lands & young slaves so to be purchased & which shall be purchased by my Exors, In the manner following that is to say after paying my lawful Debts & purchasing lands I give & Bequeath such lands so purchased to my beloved Daughters Jean & Elizabeth Clifford to be equally divided betwixt them share & share alike, either when at age or at the Day Marriage, and all moneys at Interest & young Negroes so purchased by my Exors are to be equally divided between my beloved wife, and my four children Vizt. Thomas Charles Jean & Elizabeth at the times & ages above mentioned, I also devise & Bequeath to my Dear Beloved wife over & above her Equal Division of my personal Estate, two negroes either Male or Female whichever she may think proper to make choice of, before the division of my said Estate, and to have the Disposal of these two negroes as she shall think most proper, that is to leave them at her death either amongst my four children before named or to any or either of them she pleases In Witness whereof I have again set my hand & seal The Day & year above written

South Carolina In the name of God amen I Elizabeth Miller of St Georges parish in the province of South Carolina, being in the Decline of life but of perfect & disposing mind & memory (Thanks to almighty God) and calling to mind the shortness & uncertainty of this mortal life, do make constitute Ordain and appoint this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following that is to say In the first place I will and desire that all such just and lawful Debts as at my Decease may be found due to any person or persons may be fully discharged out of my Estate by my Exor hereafter named, Item my lawful Debts being first Discharged as aforesaid (Together with my Funeral Charges) I give & Bequeath to my grandson Robert Miller Jun<sup>r</sup> all my Estate both Real & personal whosoever it may be found to him and his Heirs for ever Item I constitute and appoint my said Grandson Robert Miller Jun<sup>r</sup> my sole Exor of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof
