

Remain on any part or parcel thereof at Interest or Security or otherwise as he or they shall from time to time think most proper for the advantage good at the Request of my Estate until my loving niece Susanna Scott, an English the daughter of my loving Brother William Scott of the said Town shall attain her age of twenty one years or be married or depart this life which shall first happen, and in case my said Niece Susanna Scott shall attain her said age of twenty one years or be married which shall first happen, then upon trust that the said John Savage and John Scott or the survivor of them or the Executors or administrators of such survivor shall and do then faithfully yield pay and deliver over all and every part of my said monies and Estate Real and Personal as well the principal as the Rents and profits that shall or may have accrued or grown thereupon unto her the said Susanna Scott to whom I do hereby give devise and bequeath the same. To have and to hold thenceforward to her her heirs and assigns absolutely forever, but in case she the said Susanna Scott shall happen to depart this life, before her age of twenty one years and before Marriage then and notwithstanding upon trust that they the said John Savage and John Scott or the survivor of them, his executors administrators do and shall faithfully yield up, pay and deliver over all and every part of my said monies and estate Real and Personal into three several and distinct lots or parcels to be by them or him, first divided equally, that is to say one third part of the whole or lot, for the use and behoof of the children and future lawful issue of the body of my said Brother John Scott then surviving to be again subdivided allotted and delivered equally between and to them, him or her respectively, and to have and to hold to him, her or them severally thenceforward forever.

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and then equal lot or one third part for the use and behoof of the children or child and future issue of my loving sister Ann Savage then surviving to be again subdivided, allotted and delivered equally between (if more than one) and to him her or them respectively, and to have and to hold to him, her or them severally, thenceforward forever. And the other equal lot or one third thereof, for the use and behoof of the children and future lawful issue of the body of my said Brother William Scott then surviving and to be again subdivided allotted and delivered equally between and to him her or them respectively, and to have and to hold to him her or them, severally, thenceforward forever. I Nominate constitute and appoint the said John Savage and John Scott Executors of this my said last Will and Testament. And I hereby revoke annul and make void all other and former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made or declared either by word or writing and do ratify confirm and allow of this and no other to be my last will and Testament, In Witness whereof I the said Susanna Jones have hereunto set my hand and seal the Eighteenth day of June in the fourth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and so forth and in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and sixty four.

Dear Brothers as I apprehend that I am not long for this world I think it proper to leave you this Memorandum behind me to direct you in what I think is most proper to be done after my decease

 I give unto my wife Sarah Davidson one negro man named
 Bow with his daughter Dinah a child I then I give unto
 my said wife one bed one pair of sheets one blanket and one
 sheet. I then I give unto my said wife her choice of one horse
 with her saddle, Next I think it proper for you to sell one
 Negroe yellow called Prince with all my cattle horses Cark
 and all my household furniture consisting of beds wearing
 apparel chairs guns &c. The plantation I now live on
 it will be proper to let it to some other person if possible
 as it will be a great Emburace to the Estate. The Remainder
 of my Estate consisting of five Negroes vizt Moriah, Dinah
 Bath Elze a child sold a child, I give unto my daughter
 Sarah Davidson, This I leave as a Memorandum to George
 and William Davidson whom I appoint my Executors
 or as my last will in witness hereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this first day of March in the year
 of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty four
 1764

 by any person whatsoever and after her death it is my will that
 the said two plantations be the property and Admⁿ of my son
 William Field his Heirs and Assigns forever, to my dear and well
 beloved wife Mary Field I give devise and bequeath the entire use
 of ten cows and ten calves and twenty head sheep such as she
 shall chuse out of my stock together with their Increase and at her
 death it is my will that such as may be then alive may be divided
 Equally between my son William Field and daughter Jennet Smith
 to my said wife Mary Field I give and devise and bequeath my two
 horses so and Eliza as also all my household and kitchen furniture
 of what kind or denomination whatsoever during her natural life
 and at her death to become the property of my daughter Jennet Smith
 Jennet Smith I give devise and bequeath the Entire and absolute
 use of my plantation on Combahee River known by the name of
 Apple Bluff containing five hundred acres during her natural
 life to be by her resided on and en-titled as she shall think proper
 without any let trouble or molestation by any person whatsoever
 and after her death it is my will and I do hereby give devise and
 bequeath the said plantation on Combahee River known by the
 name of Apple Bluff containing five hundred acres to my grand
 son Charles Smith to him and his Heirs forever, I give devise and
 bequeath unto my dear and well beloved grandson Charles Smith
 all that plantation or Tract of land commonly called and known
 by the name of Clerquons run containing two hundred acres
 to him his Heirs and assigns forever. To my dear and well beloved
 grandson John Naigh Field I give devise and bequeath all that
 my plantation commonly called and known by the name of Hickory
 Hill containing five hundred and five acres as also one other
 plantation on Tract of land Contiguous thereto and containing
 three hundred and three acres to him and the Heirs of his body
 lawfully
