 or appointed declaring and pronouncing this and this
 only to be my last will and Testament. That is to say first
 of all I give and commit my soul into the hands of God
 who gave it to be redeemed justified and saved by my Lord
 and Saviour Jesus Christ my body I recommend to the Earth
 to be interred in a decent and Christian manner and as to
 ye temporal Estate which God of his Goodness hath bestowed
 upon me I do order and dispose of in manner and form
 following. I promise my Will is that all my lawful debts
 be paid and otherwise which I lawfully owe to any
 person or persons be fully discharged and paid by my
 Executors hereafter named. Item I give and bequeath to my
 well beloved wife Jane Simpson two negroes by name Mary
 and Sucho and of the sixth part of all my household furniture
 plantation tools and stock that and that only to be her part
 and portion of my Estate forever and I do desire and entreat
 her of from being heir to any of her children during underage
 Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved son William
 Simpson these negroes by name Joe and his wife Diana and
 their increase Hannah, Pious and her two children and
 their increase, Moll, Phillip, Ross and Simpson and their
 increase forever and a sixth part of the household furniture
 plantation tools and stock my Will is that in case my said
 son should die before he arrives to the years of twenty one or
 there be issue or lawfully begotten of his body that then his land be
 equally divided between his sisters and his moneyables to be
 divided into two equal parts the one half among his sisters
 and the other half to be given to the wife of my well beloved
 Brother William Simpson now residing in Maryland.
 Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved Brother William
 Simpson now residing in Maryland a tract of land
 known by the name of McKown old field if him or his heirs
 comes in to enjoy it. Item I do empower my Executors hereafter
 named to make Order to my cousin William Simpson for
 a tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres of
 which he bought and paid for and hath not yet got Order
 for it. Item my will is that the rest of my Movable Estate
 be equally divided amongst my daughters. Lastly I
 constitute and appoint my well beloved friends and first
 my well beloved Wife Jane Simpson William Simpson
 Samuel McEllean Robert Patton and James Simpson to be my
 sole

sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament of all and every
 precept article and Clause thereof Resolving Resolving and dis-
 mulling all and Every Executor or Executors Will or Wills heretofore
 by me made and appointed declaring and pronouncing this
 and this only to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness

 1762.

 Lewis her heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever.
 And lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint the
 said Mary Lewis sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament
 hereby resolving and making void all former and other Will
 and Wills Testaments by me at any time heretofore made and do
 declare this to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness
 whereof I the said Testator have hereunto set my hand and seal
 the sixth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand
 seven hundred and sixty four.
