

In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Timmons of St. Bartholomew's parish Colleton County province of South Carolina planter Being of Sound & disposing mind & memory do make & Ordain this my Last Will & Testament in manner & form following That is to say Imprimis I will that all my debts & funeral Charges be paid & Discharged by Exors herein after Named Item I give bequeath unto my Eldest Brother Richard Timmons in St. Bartholomew's parish Colleton County province aforesaid the sum of Thirty pounds South Carolina Currency. Item I give & bequeath unto my Brother John Timmons Gunsmith in Baltimore County near Joppa in Maryland the sum of Two hundred & Fifty pounds South Carolina Currency or one Negro of the value of the aforesaid two hundred & fifty pounds to be paid in a twelve Month after my decease. Item I give bequeath unto my loving Sister Sarah Galloway of Swegen in the County of Armagh in the Island the lawful sum of Twenty pound Sterling to be paid in the like space of time as above (viz^t) one Twelve month after my decease. Item I do give & devise unto my Brother George Timmons his three Sons Thomas George & John Timmons equally to be divided amongst them all my two Plantations or Tracts of Land situate lying & being in Colleton County in the province aforesaid now in the occupation of myself & aforesaid Brother George Timmons with all the Buildings & outyard Belonging thereto their Heirs & assigns forever & do also give bequeath unto my aforesaid Brother George Timmons Children that shall be alive at my decease all my Goods Chattels Household Stuffs & Rest of Estate Real & personal Whatsoever to be equally Divided amongst my said Brother George's Children Surviving at the time of my decease their Heirs and assigns forever. Lastly I do make & Constitute my aforesaid Brother George Timmons of St. Bartholomew's parish Colleton County province aforesaid planter & George Scott of Johns Island Surgeon Executors of this my Last Will & Testament Dated this Twentieth Day of June in the Year of our Lord 1756
