By the tenor of these presents We John Taylor Doctor of Laws
Dean General & Official Principal of the Right Reverend Father in
God, John by divine permission Lord Bishop of Lincoln lawfully constituted
make known to all men that upon the twenty second day of December
in the year of our Lord 1763, Before the Reverend Francis Howson
Bishop our lawful Surrogate, the Last Will & Testament of John Asline
late of the City & Diocese of Lincoln deceased but dying at Charles Town
in the Province of South Carolina in parts beyond the seas hereto annexed
was proved approved & registered, and adm^{on} of all & singular, the Goods
Chattels Rights & Credits of the said deceased & any way concerning his
will lying & being in the City & Diocese of Lincoln was granted to John
Davies & Thomas Marshall joint Executors named in the said Will
they having been first duly sworn upon the Holy Evangelists well &
faithfully to administer the same & to make a true & perfect Inventory of all
& singular the said Goods Chattels & Credits and to exhibit the same into
the registry of the Consistory Court of Lincoln or before the next day of
March next ensuing and also to render a just & true acc^t thereof
seven under the seal of our office the Day & year above written -

through Jesus Christ in hopes of a happy Immortality and
my body to be buried in a Christian like manner by my
Executors hereafter mentioned. My worldly affairs I dispose of in
the manner & form following
In witness whereof I order that all my just and lawful debts should
honestly be discharged
Item I give and bequeath to Wade Mims son to Elizabeth Mims
the just and full sum of Three thousand Pounds Current
Money of this Government My Intentions are that said Money
shall be put to Interest and that the said Wade Mims shall be

Educated with the Interest or Part of the Interest arising by my Executors but in case said Made Mings dies a Minor, said Three Thousand Pounds shall be and remain the property of Robert Blair and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Dear and Honour'd Father and Mother the Reverend William & Lucy Blair now living in North Britain and shire of Surry the sum of two hundred Pounds Sterling to each One hundred Pounds Sterling to them and their Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to Robert Blair, one of my Executors hereafter mentioned the Remaining part of my Estate to him & his Heirs forever.

I do hereby appoint Joseph Britton Esq^r and Robert Blair to be my Executors to see that this my last will and Testament be duly Executed After my Death Renouncing and Repealing all other Wills do hereby Establish & declare this to be my last Will and Testament.
