 bequeath the sum of five guineas for the like purpose; I then I give &
 bequeath unto Doctor Lionel Chalmers the sum of ten guineas and
 all the rest & residue of my Estate of what kind or manner the same
 may be with all pay and arrears of pay that may be due to me at the
 time of my death I give and bequeath the same unto my brother Thomas Hewitt
 of the City of Cork in the Kingdom of Ireland Next^{ly} & in case of his decease before
 me then to his eldest son & the Executors Administrators assigns of such eldest son for
 ever only as a further gratuity to the s^d Dr. Lionel Chalmers for his favours
 to me I give and bequeath him the further sum of twenty Guineas And I
 hereby nominate constitute and appoint the said Cap^t Arthur Price

and Dⁿ Lionel Chalmers Executors of this my last Will & Testament
 hereby revoking all former & other wills by me at any
 time heretofore made declaring this to be my last Will & Testament.

 improved since, I give, Bequeath and dispose of the same in the
 following manner and form

Imprimis After the payment of all my legal debts and funeral
 charges I order and allow my Exors after named, as soon as
 possible to make sale of my estate and the money arising therefrom
 to be put to Interest in sure hands and the said money be paid
 to each of my Grandchildren, according as they come of age or
 when they marry, and that there be an equal distribution of
 the same among them, I mean that every one of my Grandchildren
 have an equal share of my Estate.

Item I order my Exors also to make sale of the Tract of land whereon
 I now live and also that which I purchased from the Exors of
 William James and to be distributed as above, but woud
