I William Wilson of Charleston in the Province of South Carolina Merchant do this first day of May in the year of our Lord 1761 make and publish this my Codicil to my last will and testament which I have left in England in manner following I do will & give & bequeath unto Miss Eleanor Wroe daughter of Mr. James Wroe of the Town of Manchester in the County of Lancashire in that part of Great Britain called England the sum of fifty pounds Sterling money of Great Britain Item I give & bequeath unto the sons & daughters of Mr. Samuel Prioleau of Charleston Gent as follows to wit To Miss Ann Prioleau forty pounds Sterling to Miss Mary Prioleau twenty pounds Sterling to Miss Martha Prioleau ten pounds Sterling to Mr. Samuel Prioleau Jun^r Elizabeth Prioleau Philip Prioleau & West Prioleau per pounds Sterling each Item I give & bequeath to Mr. Plouder Weston of Charles Town Gent. twenty pounds Sterling Item to Mr. John Williams my Bookkeeper ten pounds Sterling And Whereas it is necessary that my affairs in the Province should be settled & brought to a speedy conclusion and that the monies due & coming unto me should be collected & gotten & then remitted to England as soon as possible after my decease and that some person should be appointed for that purpose. I do therefore nominate constitute & appoint my Cousin William Wilson now in the Island of New Providence my Executor or Trustee to transact manage & finally to settle all my affairs in this Province & to pay & discharge all my ^{just} debts together with the several legacies above mentioned. And my will is and I do hereby direct that after payment of my just debts & legacies hereinbefore particularly expressed my Executors or Trustees do remit & send to my Walter Wilson of the said Town of Manchester £1000 moneys all the rest & residue of my Estate for the purposes of my aforesaid Will & Testament. But in case my said Cousin William Wilson should not return to this Province I do then nominate & appoint my Cousin Seth Wilson of Charleston Gentleman to be my Executor & Trustee for the purposes aforesaid. And in case of his Death I do then nominate & appoint my friend Mr. William Savage of Charleston my Executor or Trustee to be for the purposes aforesaid. And it is my will & desire that

the aforesaid John Williams speaks for, contains, past, stamp the books
of James & Wilson for compounding etc. settle & adjust the affairs of James & Wilson
as well as my own private affairs. And lastly, it is my desire that this present
codicil be made & accounted as part of my last will & Testament to all intents
& purposes. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this first
