present the sum of three hundred pounds Sterling lawful Money of Great
Britain, which shall be paid by my Executors named in my before men-
tioned Will to my Brother Thomas Smith, to my son Thomas Loughton and
my friends Gabriel Maniquill, Henry Lawrens, John Ruckledge, Peter
Robert Smith and Charles Pinchney or a Majority of them, to be by them
Applied whenever they see the good Work likely to be brought to Effect and
my Executors are here by required to pay the above gentlemen the sum above
mentioned, after having six months notice given them, Item I do hereby
give and bequeath to the Church Warden and Vestry of Saint Philips
Charles Town, the sum of fifty pounds Sterling as a Subscription towards pur-
chasing a new organ for said Church, Item I give and Bequeath to my loving
Wife Mary Smith besides what I have given her in my will my Negro Carpen-
ter called named and which was bequeathed by her Mother, Item I give to
my said Wife my coach Chaise and four Horses, that I have now with me
and I do hereby declare this present Writing to be part of my last Will and
Testament Witness whereof I do hereby set my Hand and Seal this Twen-
ty fifth day of July in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven hundred
and seventy.
