this Country and to embark for England and being uncertain whether
I shall survive the Voyage altho in Perfect Health at present am dis-
posed of settling all my worldly concerns that dispute may arise after my
decease therefore make make this my Last Will and Testament.
at George Town the 13th day of August. 1774.
Firstly I desire that all the debts due to me by Bond Note or
open Account may be obtained Payment of as soon as Possible after
my decease And Secondly I desire that all my just debts in this
Province may be immediately Paid. Thirdly I give and freely Be-
queath unto my much esteemed Friend Robert Heriot Esq. of George
Town the Sum of ten Guineas to be by him laid out in buying a
mourning Ring or any thing else of that kind he may like better
and I hope will keep it for my sake fourthly I give and free ly
bequeath unto M^{rs} Mary Heriot Spence to my friend before mention-
ed as a mark of my esteem and regard for her all my Boston and
Mohogany framed Looking Glasses and also the sum of Ten
Guineas to buy a mourning Ring which I beg She may
wear for my sake these Rings to be bought England fifthly
I give and freely bequeath unto Miss Mary Deas the Sum of Ten
Guineas like ways to buy a Ring which I beg She may wear till
She is Married and then let it be sent home to my Mother if living
Sixthly I give and freely bequeath unto M^{rs} Rachel Law Miss
Rebecca Simons Miss Katherine Deas and M^{rs} Lois Hall to each
of them a very handsome mourning Ring or White Enamelled
neat as a Elephant can make one Seventhly I give and free ly Bequeath
unto James Durward Hair dresser in Geo. Town two Hundred
Pounds Currency Ninthly I give and free ly bequeath unto
my Father James Milne Esq. at Montrose in Scotland my
Negro Man Slave named Frank. and after my Fathers decease
I leave him to my Mother and after her Death to my Sister
Margaret Mill and I desire that the said Negro Man may
never be sold for a Slave to any Body but my Fathers family.

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Tenthly I desire that after the above mentioned Legacies are paid.
which may be done very soon after my Death the Remainder
of my Effect after Paying my debts like ways may be remitted in
the most sure and safe method to my eldest Brother James Mill
in London with power to him to pay my debts in England and to
give the Residence of my to my Youngest Sister Mary Mill Watson
traverse. Lastly I hereby constitute and appoint Robert Horist
Esquire and Paul Trapeier Esq. to be my Executors of this my
last Will and Testament hoping that out of Regard for me
they will be so good as accept of this trust. Written with
