

In the Name of God, Amen, I John Trink of South Carolina, being very sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory, do hereby make and publish my last Will and Testament, first committing my soul into the Hands of God that gave it and my Body to be decently Buried by the discretion of my Executors that shall give it and Bequeath to my Beloved Mother Martha Trink, all that Plantation or Tract of one hundred and fifty acres of Land whereon I am now sitting my Will is further that my Son Benjamin shall have the Use of a young Negro Wench called Pitter her life time and after her death it to be left as is after mentioned further my Will and Bequeath to my loving Brother Dennis Hankins One Negro Boy called Jacob and all the Monies in his Pocket and my Will for a new Suit of Cloaths and hose and Whip I am I further more give and bequeath to my loving Sister Anne Gaus One Negro Wench Lemmy and her Child my Brother in Law Benjamin Gaus paying fifty pounds towards payment for said Wench and Child I further give and Bequeath to my loving Brother Thomas Trink one Negro fellow called Winter and all my wearing apparel one Bed and furniture four head of poultry my Horse my watch and a Set of Silver Tea spoons and my little Gun I further give and Bequeath to my loving Brother Samuel Trink after the Death of my Mother the above mentioned Wench Pitter I further give and Bequeath after my decease to my Brother Samuel Trink my new Beaver Hat and my new Saddle and Bridle my gold Buttons and my Desk, I further more give and bequeath my Nephew Benjamin Gaus Son to Benjamin and Ann Gaus five cows and calves with their increase to be in the care of Thomas Trink untill he arrive to the Age of Twenty One Years, I further more give and Bequeath to Nephew Masters Hankins one young Bay Horse my Will is further that all the rest of my bequestes besides those already mentioned, cattle sheep and Hogs and Horses be left to my Brother Samuel Trink my will and desire is further that my loving Brothers and my Friends Dennis Hankins and Thomas Trink should act as my whole and sole Executors to order and dispose of my Estate as is before mentioned and after which I have hereunto set my Hand and seal this Tenth day of December and in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and seventy and in the Eleventh year of his Majesty's Reiga.

I George Burns of St Pauls parish in the County of Granville of South Carolina, being very sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God therefor calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that I is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say, Principally and first of all I give and Recommend my soul into the Hands of God, that gave it and for my Body I Recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting

to the general resurrection shall raise me up again by the mighty power of God
touching such worldly Estate as I have pleased God to give me in this
life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form, I give
to my beloved and beloved wife Elizabeth in the first place all my last Estate and personal
effects and I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth my Dearest beloved
the love of my whole Estate besides one Horse and saddle and a bed and furniture
and the other two parts of my Estate land and moveables I allow to be equal
divided amongst my four sons viz: John, Robert, George and William, and I
do hereby utterly disavow and disannul all and every other former Testament or
bequest and bequest by me in any way afore this time named Will and Bequest
in writing and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the day and Year
above written

being very sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory Thanks be given to
God for calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die, do make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, that is to say, I
expressly and first of all Give and Recommend my soul into the Hands of God, that God
and my Body Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner
at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at a general Resurrection I shall
raise the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate
with which I have pleased God to bless me with in this life, I Give devise and Dispose of the
same in the following manner and form viz: I Give and Bequeath to my Dearest
beloved wife Elizabeth I likewise constitute make and Ordain my only and sole Executor
of this my last Will and Testament) all my Lands Houses Negroes fellow Horses Chattels
and all my moveable Effects and monies except such sum as shall be hereafter mentioned
to be paid by and disposed of to my children during her widowhood or life and
on her Marriage or decease I constitute and Ordain my Dearest beloved son James Boyle
and give and Bequeath to my son Benjamin all my Lands and Negroes fellow with
other Effects my Executors or guardians see proper to give to him to be possessed of
said Guardians at the Marriage or decease of my beloved wife or Executor and if
shall be equally divided between my other two sons James and John Boyle, and
I Give and Bequeath to my beloved Daughter Margaret Brian one hundred fifty
pounds currency to be paid out of my Monies and likewise to my Daughter
