Imprimis I give to my Brother James Stone all my Horned Cattle be the Quantity more or less, as also my Negroe Boy named Peter to him and his Heirs for ever, Item I give to my sister Mary Swins my father Bed and furniture to her proper use, Item I give to my Sister Agnes Heddall four Slaves named Old Phillis, Dorinda, Sarah and Phillis to her and her Heirs forever, and at the Death of Agnes, to be divided among my Relations as she the said Agnes, shall think proper. Lastly I will my Body to be buried by my Executors at their Discretion namely my Brother James Stone and John Swins, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 27 day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred & Seventy one

Imprimis I give devise and Bequeath unto my beloved Wife Anne Gains, the use of all my Real and Personal Estate whatever during the Term of her Natural Life, All my Lawful Debts being first paid, Item it is my Will and Pleasure and I do hereby give devise and Bequeath after the death of my said Wife Anne Gains, all my Real Estate that I am now possessed of unto my beloved Son Richard Gains, to him his Heirs and assigns for ever, Item It is my Will and Pleasure that my Wife Anne Gains do bring up bloath and maintenance all my children viz. Richard Gains, Ridger Gains, Henry Gains, Sarah Gains, Mary Gains, Ann Gains, and Joseph Gains share and share alike, to them their Heirs and assigns forever. And Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my good Friend Philip Ridger Executor of this my last Will and Testament revoking all other Wills and

Province of South Carolina being sick and weak of Body, but of sound and perfect memory, be-
lieve in God for the same do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and
form following, hereby revoking all former and other Wills by me heretofore made, in the
first place I give and Bequeath my Soul to the Almighty God who gave it me, humbly
trusting for his Mercy through the merits of my blessed Saviour and my Body I
assign to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mention-
ed and as to what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon me with my Will and
desire is that it be divided as follows, I give and Bequeath, to my
beloved Wife Jane Kitchen One hundred acres of Land to include the Plantation
whereon I now live to begin at the lower Corner of my Land and to lie on the
South side of Rocky Creek. ALSO One Negro Man named Bass and one negro Woman named
Susan, to enjoy the same during the Time of her remaining a Widow and no longer and in Case of
her Death or marrying again the said One hundred Acres of Land and two Slaves to descend
to my Son Elay Kitchen, I also give to my said Wife One Bay Horse called Jack, Five Cows and
Calves which she shall chuse out of my Stock, the Saddle which she now uses, One Mare and Colt
which ever she shall chuse out of my Stock of the Horse kind, One feather Bed and furniture
the best I have and One other Bed and Furniture now standing in the End Room, Item I
give and Bequeath unto William Kitchen alias William Summerford my Son by Jane
Summerford two hundred Acres of Land being part of the Tract I now live on, to lie on the
North side of Rocky Creek and to begin at the lower end of the Tract, also One young negro
Man named Sharps and One Rifle Gun, Item I Bequeath and Give unto my Son Zachary
Kitchen One hundred and fifty Acres of Land at the upper End of the Tract I now live
on and being the Remainder of the same, also One negro fellow named Arch and one
smooth Bored Gun in laid with Brass, Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter
Priscilla Kitchen One Negro Girl named Beck, Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son
John Kitchen One Negro Boy named Harry, Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son
James Kitchen One Negro Girl named Rose, Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daugh-
ter Ann Kitchen One Negro Girl named Grace, Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son
Charles Kitchen One Negro Woman named Phillis, Item In case my Wife shall be
with Child and the same shall live, I give unto the said Child One Negro Girl named
Lucy, But in case she shall not prove with Child or the Child shall die before it comes
to Age, then I give the aforesaid Negro Girl to my Daughter Mary Kitchen, Item I
