my Body to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors and as for my  
Mortally Estate I give and devise as followeth V: I give and Bequeath to my  
et Wife Francis Moore the Use of the Land whereon I live on which Land I bought of  
Doe during her life a Widowhood and at the Expiration of her life or Widowhood I  
do hereby bequeath the above mentioned Land to my son William Moore and his heirs for  
All the rest and residue of my Estate my Will and desire is to be equally divided be  
my Beloved Wife Francis Moore and my three Children, and I do hereby constitute and  
appoint my loving Wife Francis Moore and John Tind of Tyger River in said Province  
Executors of this my last Will and Testament Unnouncing all other Will or Wills which  
I have made to be my last Will and Testament. In witness hereof I have set my hand  
Seal this first day of November 1770.

 the Infant my said Wife is now pregnant with, be it either Son or Daughter then and there like  
 to her and her heirs and assigns for ever. Item it is my Will and I hereby give devise and be-  
 queath unto my beloved Children to wit Ann and Catherine and the Child my Wife is now preg-  
 nant with, be it either Son or Daughter all the residue of my Personal or moveable Estate share  
 and share alike to them their heirs and assigns for ever. Item it is my Will and I hereby give de-  
 vise and Bequeath unto the Child my Wife is now pregnant with, if a Son one half of a tract of  
 Land lying and being in St. John Parish, Newbury County to him his heirs and assigns for ever. Item  
 It is my Will and I hereby give devise and Bequeath unto my beloved Brother Joseph Palmer the other  
 half of the above said Tract of Land in St. John's parish as above represented to him his heirs and  
 assigns for ever. Item it is my Will and I hereby give devise and Bequeath unto my youngest Sister  
 Jean Palmer the Sum of Ten pounds of annuity till she arrives to the years of fifteen years of age  
 if she should live so long towards her maintenance. Item it is my Will and I hereby Order and direct  
 that if the Child my Wife is now pregnant with should be a Son and should die before he arrives  
 to the age of Twenty one years then his part of the said Land as above devised shall be sold by my  
 Executors hereafter mentioned and the money arising from said Land to be equally divided among  
 the Survivors or Survivors of my Children to them and their heirs for ever. Item it is my Will and  
 I hereby Order and direct that if any of my Children should die before they arrive to the age of  
 Twenty one years or day of marriage that the Survivors or Survivors of them shall inherit his  
 her or their parts to them their heirs and assigns for ever. Item it is my Will and I hereby  
 Order and direct that all the profits arising from my Estate till my several Children shall  
 arrive to the age above mentioned be put out on Interest or laid out in Money for my Children  
 as my Executors hereafter shall think it most beneficial for my Children. Lastly I do hereby no-  
 minate constitute and Appoint my Beloved Friend Horwich Maham my sole Executor with  
 full Power and Authority to fulfill this my last Will and Testament. Revoking and Disannul-  
 ling all former or other Wills by me made and acknowledging this to be my last and only true  
 Will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this eighteenth day of  
 November, One Thousand seven hundred and Seventy.
