

In the of God Amen I Jacob Miller of Colleton County & Beutholomews parish, province of S^c Carolina Sadler Being weak in body but of sound & perfect Mind & Memory, And Calling to mind the Mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die, do make constitute & Ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following, first I give & recommend my Soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it & my body to the Earth to be buried in a Decent Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors whom I shall hereafter mention & as to my worldly Estate I do give & dispose of the same in Manner & form following, Item that after all my funeral Charges & all my lawfull Debts are paid I do give & bequeath unto John Audibert the sum of two hundred pounds Currency to be paid out of my said Estate, Item I give & bequeath unto Doctor Joseph Delepine the sum of fifty pound Currency. Item I give & Bequeath unto James Stewart the sum of forty pounds together with all my wearing Apparel, Item I give & bequeath unto George Caborn Son to Robert Caborn three cows & three Calves & three horses if to be found, Item I give & bequeath unto James Miller all the Shoes for himself & his wife that now stand charged against him in my books & all my book accounts against him in full, Item I give unto Negro Mungo all my Old Cloaths & the rest of my estate to be sold by my Executors to the best advantage, And I do hereby constitute & appoint my trusty & Loving friends John Audibert & James Stewart my true & lawfull Executors of this my last will & testament & I do hereby revoke disannul & make void all former & other will or wills by me before made & I do declare this to be my last will & testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fifth day of March Anno Domini 1772

Children Ben & Dick, James & Dick the Carpenter, Amelia
Lucinda & her son Daniel little Bloe & their Issue to him &
his heirs, but I do earnestly recommend it to my said son Alex
ander that he do hereafter give to my Son John Fraser & my Grand
son these negroes last bequeathed to him that is to say Czarina &
her Children Ben & Dick, James & Dick the Carpenter, Amelia
Lucinda & her son Daniel little Bloe & their Issue & I do also
recommend it to my said Son Alexander to give hereafter to
his Daughter Mary, Betty Child Toby Item I give & be-
queath unto my Grand son John my Silver Coffee pot &
waiter belonging to it silver milk pot & Silver punch ladle
& Stand of Croquets with Silver Taps And I do earnestly
recommend it to my daughter Susannah Lorimer to give to her
Nephew my Grandson John Fraser her share or part of the
amount of the Negroes that belonged to her Sister Judith, Item I
give & bequeath to my said Daughter Ann all my Cloaths &
meaning Apparel, Item I give & bequeath to my Son Alexander
