Thirdly I give & bequeath to Joseph Lejeune son of Peter Lejeune
of George town my Negroe woman Silvia & her son Marcus with
the future Issue & increase of the said Negroe Woman to be
delivered to him at the Death of my wife Anna White, but in
case the Joseph Lejeune should die before he is intitled to re-
ceive & possess the said Negroe Woman Silvia & her son Marcus
with the future Issue & increase of the said Negroe Woman then
in such case the said Woman Silvia her son Marcus & the future
Issue & increase of the said ^{Negroe} Woman shall be possessed & enjoyed, by
all the Children then living of the said Peter Lejeune & Mary
his wife to be divided between them share & share alike, fourthly
I give & bequeath to my dear wife Anna White all the rest &
residue of my Estate of what nature or kind soever it may
Consist, Lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint my said wife
Anna White sole Executrix of this my Will, hereby revoking &
Annulling all other & former Wills by me heretofore made in
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this thir-
teenth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand
Seven hundred & Seventy two

 My will is that my lawfull & beloved Wife Margaretha
 Ullerich shall have & hold all my Estate that is to say household
 Goods Bedding furniture Books & Shop goods what kind so ever
 both real & Personal shall come & fall to the hands of my beloved
 wife Maria Margaretha Ullerich & shall naturally after my
 Burial take possession thereof, Further It is my will that
 my Eldest Son John Ullerich shall have all my horses what
 belongs to me or my Estate it is likewise my will that my
 Eldest Daughter Elisabeth Redelsbergen, So even my
 Second daughter Eva Roumner shall receive after Burial
 each of them the sum of Twenty five pound South Carolina
 Current Money by the hand of my beloved Wife Maria
 Margaretha Ullerich which shall be their share of my
 Estate, as aforesaid my son the horses & fifty pounds Current
 Money for my two daughters between them both, I do also
 here appoint my beloved Wife Maria Margaretha Ullerich
 to be Executrix of this my Intestimony whereof I have
 herunto Subscribed my hand & put my seal this day
 of February 16th 1769
