Building and Endowment of said College as soon as a Law is passed by the
Legislature for that purpose I Give and Devise to the three Sons of John
to wit John Thomas and Charles Daniel Parker and to their
Heirs and assigns for ever Five hundred pounds Sterling each And
I hereby authorize and empower my Executors in the most full
and ample manner to dispose of at publick Vendue or otherwise all
my part of my Estate real or personal for the payment of all my
debts and Legacies and that the Interest due on all my Book Debts
be fully paid and satisfied I Give and Devise unto my Nephew
Samuel Shoutenburgh and to his Heirs and assigns forever all the
Residue of my Estate that I now possess or may hereafter
acquire to on Condition nevertheless that he pays annually unto
my son Arthur Delany the Sum of Three hundred and fifty
