together with their Issue. Item I give & bequeath to my
Daughter Susanna Wife to Mr Charles Lorimer my Negro
Wench Morrie, Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter
Ann wife to Mr Owen Roberts my Negroes Ben, Wapping
Geney, Old, Sue & her Daughter little Sue, Item I give &
bequeath unto my Son Alexander my Negroes Agarina & her
Children Bon & Dick, James & Dick the Carpenter, Amelia
Lucinda & her son Daniel little Bloe & their Issue to him &
his heirs, but I do earnestly recommend it to my said son Alex-
ander that he do hereafter give my Son John Travers & my Grand-
son these negroes last bequeathed to him that is to say Agarina &
her Children Bon & Dick, James & Dick the Carpenter, Amelia
Lucinda & her son Daniel little Bloe & their Issue & I do also
recommend it to my said son Alexander to give hereafter to
his Daughter Mary, Betty Child Toby Item I give & be-
queath unto my Grandson John my Silver Coffee pot &
waiter belonging to it silver milk pot & silver purrich ladle
& Stand of Crockets with Silver Taps And I do earnestly
recommend it to my daughter Susannah Lorimer to give to her
Nephew my Grandson John Travers her share or part of the
amount of the Negroes that belonged to her Sister Judith, Item I
give & bequeath to my said Daughter Ann all my Cloaths &
meaning Apparel, Item I give & bequeath to my Son Alexander

my Daughter Anne to be equally Divided between them all my
 China, Item I give & bequeath unto my grand son John Fraser
 the best Drawers that stand in my Chamber together with
 the Bedstead & Curtains & two Bed Quilts that are flower'd
 up the Middle, Item I do recommend it to my Son Alex-
 ander that the Negroes Old Bloy & Betty bequeath'd to him
 he do hereafter give to my Grand daughter Judith, Item I
 do give to my Grandson John Fraser all my right share
 of the Estate of my Daughter Judith that in any way
 became entitled to & I do also give & bequeath to my said
 Grandson John Fraser all & every thing that may be
 found of any household furniture belonging to me, Lastly I
 do Nominate & appoint my Son Alexander Fraser to be the ex-
 ecutor of this my last will & testament dated this twenty
 eighth day of February & in the year of our Lord One thou-
 sand seven hundred & Seventy two
