

South Carolina This instrument of Writing Witnesseth, That
John's Island — I William Chaplin of the Place aforesaid
being sick in Body, yet of sound mind and Memory by the
assistance of God, do make it to contain & express my last
Will and Testaments, as concerns the disposal & Settlement of
my Worldly Estate both Real and Personal. To wit after
my Decease, and agreeably to Law, I desire that my just
Debts be paid. Then I desire, that all the Estate which
I possessed previous to the marriage of my present Beloved
Wife Mary Chaplin, as well as all since the marriage, as
well as all and every part which I own either in my own
Rights, or which she inherits or may inherit from her late
Father Richard Freeman gent^{le} be consolidated or united
into one Bulk and the same be equally divided in the follow-
ing manner. To wit The whole property previous to the coming
of age of my Son William W. Chaplin to remain in the use
& occupation of my said Wife Mary and all the Children
by me by her begotten & to her & their use & Benefit under
the Trust and Direction of my Executors until my said Son
William shall arrive to the age of Twenty one year at
which time, my Executors shall cause to be appraised off
& given him the amount value, or Share of all the personal

Property equal to a Childs part, the Remainder of my
 Estate to be left undivided until each of the other Children
 respectively come of age, and then in the like manner of
 William's Share, appointed off accordingly And it is hereby
 declared to be my Intention, that the Plantations where
 I now reside, shall be occupied by my said Wife Mary
 during her life; and at her Decease then my said Execu-
 tors shall by sale or otherwise make equal Division as
 in their Discretion shall think fit, Yet in case my said
 Wife Mary should think proper hereafter not to reside
 or occupy any Part of my said Plantation, still the
 same shall not be sold but be kept as a Home for all
 my said Children until the youngest one then living arrives
 to full age, at or after which Time as soon as con-
 venient, my Executors shall make equal share among
 my said Wife and the said Children. Further it is my
 Will and Desire that at the Decease of my said Wife
 Mary, all the property which she will claim the justly
 entitled to under this Will, shall revert to my said
 Estate & be divided among my Children & the survivors
 of them this or their Heirs. In the mean time during the
 happening of the foresaid events, the Proceeds & Profits of
 the Labor of my said Wife Mary in the Plantations

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of them this or their Heirs. In the mean time during the
happening of the foresaid events, the Proceeds & Profits of
the Labor of my Negroes as well as the Benefit of all
my Stocks, to the use and maintenance of my said
Wife during her Natural Life and also for the maintenance
support as well as the Education of all my said Children
until such Time as he, she or they shall receive their
Respective shares or Divisions of the said Estate And I
do also further Will and desire, that in Case all my said
Children should die without leaving Lawful Issue, then
their Respective Parts or Proportions which they will receive
under this Will, to go to and be divided between my two
Nephews; John and Joseph Tinsdale and their Lawful
Representatives, And lastly, I do hereby Revoke disavow
& make void, all other Gifts Wills & Testaments by me heretofore
made, & do declare this to be my last and only Will and
Testament in which in the Presence of these Witnesses; I
appoint my Friends James Freeman and Benjamin Freeman
Executors.

Estate. Houses and Lands, to them and their Successors
forever; The Rents thereof, or the proceeds arising
from the Sale thereof to be by them appropriated to the
aid and propagation the Gospel to Jesus Christ
