I William Johnstone of the City of Charleston and State aforesaid School Master, being sick and weak in body, but of sound Mind, Memory and Understanding, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say, first where as my Wife Sarah Vincent Johnstone was before her Intermarriage with me, died and possessed in her own Right of all that Lot, piece or parcel of land in Liberty Street situate on the North side thereof, containing in front on said Street forty feet and in depth one hundred and forty three feet more or less, with the buildings thereon and the appurtenances thereof; also the following Negroes, namely, Tom, Charlotte and her Child Hester, Pina and her Child Sal, Clarissa, Harriette and Dimbo; and also the following articles of Household furniture, to wit, eight Mahogany Tables, one book case

37 with the Books contained therein, two Chests of Drawers, two Mahogany Bed-Steeds, two feather beds and bed linen, three dozen Chairs and four looking glasses; all which were by deed of settlement entered into and dated the sixteenth day of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety four, conveyed to John Caspar Folker Esquire of the City and State aforesaid, In trust for the uses and purposes therein contained and particularly expressed which reference being had to the said deed will fully appear. And I deem it just and proper that the same and every part thereof should revert to my said Wife after my decease (should I leave no Children living at my death begotten on the body of my said Wife, to take under the conditions and provisions of the said deed of settlement) in as full and ample a manner as she possessed them before her intermarriage with me, I do therefore hereby give, devise and bequeath unto my said Wife Sarah Vincent Johnstone all the right title and Interest, legal or equitable in possession, reversion or remainder, vested or to vest which I the said William Johnstone my heirs, executors or administrators now have or might or could or shall have of, In or to all and singular the lot of land Negroes and Household furniture aforesaid together with the appurtenances of the said lot of land and the Issue and Increase, present and future, of the said Negroes and every part thereof, whether claimed by through or under the deed of settlement aforesaid or the marital rights which I shall or may have acquired by virtue of my intermarriage with my said Wife, or in any other manner or way whatsoever. To have and to hold the same unto the said Sarah Vincent Johnstone her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns for ever to and for her and their only proper use and behoof. Also I give devise and bequeath unto my said Wife Sarah Vincent Johnstone all the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate, real and personal whatsoever and whosoever, whether in possession, reversion or

remainder, vested or to vest or in which I have any right, title or
Interest, legal or equitable whatsoever. To have and to hold the
same and every part thereof to my said Wife Sarah Vincent
Johnstone, her heirs, Executors, Administrators and assigns to and
for her and their only proper use and behoof for ever. And
I do hereby Nominate, Constitute and appoint my beloved
Wife Sarah Vincent Johnstone aforesaid, sole Executrix of
this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all for-
mer Will and Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness
