

6P^o I William Reynolds of Wadmelaw make this my last Will and Testa-
ment. I resign my Soul to its Creator in all humble hope of its
future happiness as in the disposal of a Being infinitely just and my
body to be buried at the discretion of my relatives, and as to my Estate
my just debts being first paid, I dispose of it in the following manner.
To my loving wife I give and bequeath the plantation where I now
live called Mudbluff together with a child's part of the personal Estate,
to her and her heirs forever. All the rest of my Estate both real and personal
I give to be equally divided among my children, share and share alike
to them and their heirs forever, and should any of my children die unmar-
ried or under age then my will is that their portions of the Estate be equally
divided among the Survivors or Survivor of them to them and their heirs
forever, and if all should die under age or day of marriage then these
property or the whole Estate shall go to my wife to her and her heirs for-
ever. I constitute and appoint my loving wife Sarah Reynolds sole Exe-
cutrix to this my last Will and Testament, and my Will is that when any
of ^{my} children come of age or marry that their portion be given up to them
as soon thereafter as possible and I give power to my Executrix to purchase
property or dispose of the same or do any act that appear to be for the
benefit of the Estate. Witness my hand and Seal the first day of
April 1818.
