on the sixth day of January in the year of our Lords One thousand Eight hun-
-dred and fourteen and therein particularly described together with the
present and future issue and increase of the female Slaves. all the rest
-residue and remainder of my Estate real and personal whatsoever
-ever I give and devise absolutely and forever to the said Eliza Bull & William
Bull. I nominate and appoint my friends James R. Pringle and William
Mason Smith Esquires Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness
