Amen I William Wadsworth of the City of Charleston in the State aforesaid formerly Grocer being of Sound mind memory and understanding (blessed be Almighty God for the same) but considering the uncertainty of this mortal life do make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say. First I give devise and bequeath unto Mary Anne Kinlock, eldest daughter of George Kinlock of the City of Charleston and State aforesaid Grocer and of Charlotte his Wife, all that Lot of Land with the Houses and tenements thereon wherein I now reside Situated and being on the East side of Archdale Street in the City and State aforesaid now or formerly Known by the number thirty six No 36 to have and to hold the said lot of land with the appurtenances unto the said Mary Anne Kinlock should she survive me and to her heirs forever, not subject to the debts or Control of any husband she may have but to be for her sole and Separate use. But should the said Mary anne Kinlock depart this life before me and before this Will goes into effect then and in that case I give devise and bequeath the said Lot of Land aforesaid with the Houses and Tenements thereon to Emma Granby the next eldest daughter of the said George Kinlock & Charlotte his Wife, to have and to hold the said Lot of land with the appurtenances (in the event aforesaid) unto the said Emma Granby Kinlock and to her heirs forever, not Subject to the debts or control of any Husband she may have, but to be for her sole and Separate use. And it is my Will and desire that the said George Kinlock should undertake the Guardianship of either of his said Daughters who may under the Contingency aforesaid become entitled to the Estate above devised and that

he shall take charge of and manage the same for her benefit until she may arrive at the age of twenty one years or day of marriage. But should the said Mary anne Kinlock and Emma Granby Kinlock both depart this life before my decease, it is in that event my will and desire that the abovementioned premises should be sold to the best advantage and the proceeds thereof divided between and among the remaining Daughters of the said George & Charlotte Kinlock who may then be alive and if no daughters be then living, between and among the sons of the said George & Charlotte Kinlock share and share alike. Item It is my Will and desire that the Lot of Land which I own with the buildings thereon situated on the west side of the said street and nearly opposite the abovementioned premises and now or formerly known by the number twenty five N 25 and also one other Lot of Land with the tenements and appurtenances thereon Situated on the North Side of Chalmers Street now or formerly Known by the number twelve (12) all in the Said City of Charleston together with all my Stock in Trade should I leave any and all my goods chattels and Effects which I may be possessed of at the time of my decease shall be sold to the best advantage as soon after that event happeneth as may be convenient and practicable and that the nett amount in each arising from the sale thereof (after my just debts and funeral expences are paid) shall be named and that the Interest arising therefrom together with the Interest accruing from other Bank Stock that I may be possessed of I desire to be paid annually as it becomes due to my beloved Sister Anne Touch, Widow or to her duly authenticated order, which said Anne Touch is now or was lately residing in James Street, Manchester Square, City of London in the Kingdom of Great Britain, during her natural Life, the Principal of the whole amount of Bank or other Stock to

remain unappropriated until the death of my said Sister Anne Touch then to be disposed of as follows Viz<sup>t</sup> I Give devise and bequeath the said Bank or other Stock unto each & every of the sons and Daughters of the Late Robert and Ann Whitley of Norton in the County of Yorkshire in Great Britain deceased to be divided and distributed among each and every one of them in equal proportions Share and Share alike and in case that any one or more of the sons and Daughters of the said Robert & Anne Whitley shall be dead at the time of my decease and Leaving issue, then it is my will and desire that the portion Share or dividend intended to be given unto the son or Sons Daughter or Daughters of the said Robert and Ann Whitley so deceased shall devolve and be paid unto the child or children of each of the deceased to be divided among the surviving child or children of each the aforesaid separte Share or portion in equal proportions share and share alike (Excepting neverthelefs William Whitley the son of Benjamin & Harriet Whitley who for reasons which his own conscience must remind him of, I give unto him the said William Whitley One shilling Sterling and no more. And I do hereby nominate and appoint my worthy and trusty friends David Bell and Charles Edmonston of said City of Charleston and also my worthy and trusty friends, the worthy friends also of my said Sister Vizt John Pearse and his Nephew Robert Vincent a Soliciter, both of the City of London to be the Executors of this my Last Will and Testament and it is my particular request that the Gentlemen first named who are my friends and fellow Citizens will take care that the aforesaid Property shall be disposed of to the best advantage for the use and benefit of my dear friends and relatives to whom I have devised & bequeathed the same and that they will as soon as may be convenient after my decease

transmit a copy of this my Will to the Parties herein concerned, residing in Great Britain and Will exert themselves to see the same executed and performed according to my true intent and meaning. And I do hereby revoke all former Will & Wills heretofore by me made and do declare this my Last Will and Testament. In Witnefs whereof I the said William Wadsworth have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this fifth day of June in the year of Our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Twenty Seven and in the Fifty first year of American Independence.
