shall be sold and the money to be equally divided between my four chil-  
dren that is James Bockfield Benjamin Bockfield John Bockfield and  
Mary M<sup>rs</sup> Keown. And I hereby appoint and constitute Capt James  
Dehay and my Son Benjamin Bockfield Executors to this my last  
Will and testament: in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and Seal.

Secondly, I give to my Son William all my negroes, namely, Flora, Delila, Jack, Bess, Bella, Lucy, Isaac, Richard, Flora, Plato, Rachel, Prince, Diana, the foregoing negroes were left my Son by his Grandmother Elizabeth Singleton; I also leave my Son my negroes Nell, Isaac, & Toby & their future issue forever, but should my Son die under age without issue, in that case I direct that the latter three negroes & their issue be sold for cash and the proceeds equally divided between my Sisters Martha Ann Kelly's children. I also give to my said Son all my other property of every kind whatsoever & lastly I nominate my friend Simon Magwood Executor to this my last Will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal dated at Charleston the twentieth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.
