I James Moor of Sandy River Camden District and province of South Carolina do make Confir: this to be my last will and Testament disanulling all former will or Wills whatsoeover herebefore made by me and as I the Said James Moor being now in Perfect Health and memory as well knowing that it is appointed by our Supreme Being for all men and once to dy and has seen his will and pleasure to Grant or bestow on me Some of this worldly Goods and Treasure I do will and dispere of all the same in manner following in the first place I recommend my Soul to God that Gave it existence in the Next place I do Recommend my Body to the dust of which it was made and to be in a Christian like manner Buried at the discretion of my Executor when ever it is his will to Call me, In the next place my will and desire is that all my Just debts be paid and then I do dispose of the remaining of my state in form and manner following In the next place do lend to my well beloved wife Dorothy Moor during her natural life the Lands plantation and Mill all being and Lying on Brushy fork of Sandy River and well known by the place and plantation where on I now live Also one Negro Girl named Millie with all her increase and also all my Household furniture and stock of every kind During her natural life and after her Death the Land prescribes Negro Girl and her increase and stocks of every kind As above mentioned to descend to my well beloved Son Thomas Moor and His Heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved Son Lazarus Moor Fifty Acres of land on Brushy fork of Sandy River Being the plantation he

Per cert Health and memory am well knowing that at it is
pointed by our Supreme Being for all men and once to dy and
has been his will and pleasure to Grant or bestow on me some
of this worldly Goods and Treasure I do will and dispose of all
the same in manner following in the first place I recommend my
Soul to God that Gave it existence in the next place I do Re-
commend my Body to the Dust of which it was made and to be in a
Christian like manner Buried at the direction of my Executor
when ever it is his will to Call me, In the next place my will
and desire is that all my Just Debts be paid and then I do Dis-
pose of the remaining of my state in form and manner follow-
ing In the next place do lend to my well beloved wife Dorothy
or Arin; her Natural life the Lands plantation and till all
being and lying on Brushy fork of Sandy River and well known
by the place and plantation where on I now live Also one negro
Girl named Millie with all her increase and also all my House-
hold furniture and stock of every kind During her natural life
and after her Death the Land prenises Negro Girl and her increase
and stocks of every kind As above mentioned to descend to my
well beloved Son Thomas Moor and His Heirs forever Item I give
and bequeath to my well beloved Son Lazarus one Fifty Acres
of land on Brushy fork of Sandy River Being the plantation he
now lives also one Hundred Acres of Land on Indian Creek to
him and his Heirs for ever Item I give and Bequeath to my well
beloved Daughter Catey Sanders fifteen pounds Lawfull pro-
clamation money of this province to be paid her out of my person-
al estate to her and her Heirs forever and I give and Bequeath
to my beloved Son James Moor one Hundred Acres of land situated
lying and being on Broad River on North Side to him and his
Heirs for ever Item I give and Bequeath to my well beloved Son

Charlie Moor Three Hundred And Twenty-five Acres ~~southward~~ land
Bread River the North Side Being part of a Tract Called the
Beauty Spot the Remainder of the Same tract of ~~land~~ land Con-
taining Six Hundred Acres I give and Bequeath to my Beloved
Son John Moor to him and his Heirs forever Item I give and
Bequeath to my well Beloved Daughter Dorotha Moor Twenty pounds
proclamation lawfull money of this province by will and desire
is that in Case either of my aforementioned Children Lazarus
Moor Catey Gancers James Moor Robert Moor John Moor and Dorotha
Moor if each or either of them Should Die Before my Son Thomas
Moor Should Become of Lawful age then they and Each of their
Respective Legacys to be Returned to my Son Thomas Moor his
Heirs and Afters for ever and all this I do Acknowledge and
Confirm to be my last will and Testament Made this fifteenth
day of January in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven
hundred And Seventy Nine.
