of Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection of
I shall receive The same by the mighty Power of God & as
touching wordly Estate wherewith it hath Pleased God to bless me
in this Life I give & bequeath & Dispose of the same in the follow
ing manner & form. Imprimis. I give and bequeath to Barbara my
dearly beloved wife a Horse, Saddle and Bridle, ~~Red Bedgones~~,
also all her body clothes & if in case she Marries again, all
over & above not here after Mentioned to ~~Behers~~ & at her
Disposal according to the Discretion of my Eceutors. Secondly,
~~again~~ I give to my well beloved Son Samuel that Plantation or
Tract of 200 acres of Land that William Adaiys live upon, said
Tract bounded Westerly by land of Sm. Willsons, Easterly by
land of John Bonners. Thirdly I give unto my beloved
Daughter Martha HOFFET Fifty Pounds Sterling lawful money of
this State South Carolina. Fourthly. I Give unto my two well
beloved sons, VIZ Jamey & John Fifty Pounds sterling Each, Law-

ful Money of the afore / State said Money to be Raised &
levied of the Moveables of my Estate,---Fifthly, I give bequest
unto my two youngest well beloved Sons William & David the

live in, & to have a lawful support or Maintenance of the

Plantation I now live u on And further also Follow if any of my children Die before the arrive at the years of ~~18~~ ~~19~~ that their Part be Divided Equally amongst The rest of my Children. Also + allow that if the Property I now possess comes to be Reduced to a lower Value (then at Recent) before each of my Legatus comes to get their part or share; that each of them (accce my Son Samuel) is to loose an Equal Proportion. Also I make & ordain my only & Sole Executors James. & Alexander Chesnat & my Dearlly beloved Wife Barbara as head & Chief Executrix, all of Little Hockey Creek whom I constitute & ordain as above. And every other former Testaments Wills & Legacies Requests & Executors by me in any wise before this time Named Will & Bequeathed, Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my ony last will & Testament.
