(Viz) First, I gill that all those debts and dues which I owe, shall be well and truly contented and paid, or ordained to be paid within Convenient time after my decease, by my Executors hereafter named.

I give and bequeathe unto my Dearly Beloved Wife, all property whatsoever I am possessed faster the discharge of all my debts, both real, and personal Estate Consisting of Land, Negroes,

Horses, Cattle, Hogs, Plantation tools, Household, & Kitchen furniture, with every other property whatsoever, to be and remain her own proper, during her Widowhood, or Life, to be at her disposible to sales support herself and my Children with, and at her Death, or Marriage for all property Whatsoever belonging to the Estate to be equally divided among my Children, to be managed for them as my Executors hereafter named may see & think propper, each Childs portion to be delivered them when they arive at Mabure age, or marriage. But the property to remain my Wife's during her Lifetime provided she does not marry. But 1f she should Change her Widowhood, the property to be here only to the day of marriage, after which all property whatsoever belonging to the Estate to be taken immediately out of her hande, and managed for the good of My Children.
