I order to be decently buried in its Kindred Earth in the family burying ground on Jackson Creek, and as to the property real and personal which God in his great kindness has bestowed upon me it is my will and Desire that they be disposed of in the manner following Viz after all my Just and lawfull debts are paid

Imprimis I give and bequeath Unto my loving wife Margaret Robertson provided She does not marry again, or during her widowhood all the plantation ~~Will Book 2, 492-1795~~ ^{www.southcarolinapioneers.net} all the Stock and plantation Tools furniture & for the purpose of Raising and Educating the children, but in case she chooses to marry again then she is to get one horse and adle Valued at Twelve pounds Sterling with a bedding of clothes and a child's part of the household furniture with two Cows and Calfs She is to retain Said property for the Education and raising The children Viz Each Girls part until She marries and Each Boys part until ~~they~~ ^{they} comes of age

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Son John Robertson One hundred Acres of Land that I purchased of Andrew Cameron Also One Negroe man Named Sharpes, but in Case the hereafter to be bequeathed Negroe wench Ursa has no more children, then the Said John Robertson is to give unto his two Youngest Brothers fifteen pounds Sterg when he comes of Age

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Son Alexander

Robertson One hundred acres of Land out of that Tract
formerly McClelands with the above Named Negroe wench
Named Ursa when he comes of age, and is to pay fifteen
pounds Sterling unto his two youngest Brothers Joseph and
Simon in Case Ursa has not any more children but in case
She has one more child it is to be divided Equally between
Joseph & Simon and then John & Alexander are only to pay
Their brothers Joseph and Simon Only Seven pounds ten Shill-
ings Sterling apiece and in Case She has two then They
are to be given to the said Joseph and Simon, and John and
Alexander are to give Their Youngest brothers Nothing

of which with The Household furniture & to be at the Sole
disposal of my loving wife Margaret Robertson while She
continues a widow

nd Lastly I Constitute and appoint Simon Cameron James Ca -
eron and David Hamilton Executors to this my last will and
Testament In witnefs whereof I have hereinto Set my hand
& Seal the Twenty fifth day of January one Thousand Seven
hundred and Ninety Six
