

I Anne McFadden of the State of South Carolina and County of Fairfield being very sick & weak in (or imperfect health of body, Best for and) of perfect mind & memory, thanks be given unto God, And knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say, Principally and first of all I Give and recommend my soul unto the hands of almighty God. that gave it and my body ~~te-the~~ I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent christian burrial at the discretion of my excecutors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such wordly state wherewith it hath pleased God to blefs me, in this Life, I Give dispose & dismise of the following manner and form First I Give and bequeath to Hanna Long---one Red motley faced Heifer. Item I Give and bequeath Anne Graham Five Fairfield County Will Book 12, 1792-1795 and bequeath to Rachel Agnes one black and white spotted Heifer two years old Item I Give and bequeath to Elisha McFadden one Horse Colt with a blaze in his Face, Item I Give and bequeath to my daughter Mary McFadden my Saddle and Bridle, one chest, one new Bible, one pair of Silver Shoe--buckles, all my wearing clothes but one blue gown, one yew and Lamb--one black and white Hieffer three years old, Item I Give & bequeath to Jefse McFadden and Rebecah McFadden all the rest of my property, Rebeccah to have my Bleu Gown, and and these three youngest children, all to go to one House, & two Cows and Calves to go with them and at their fredom to have two Cows as good as John Longs, but if they have not their Health I desire that James Blare on Fishing Creek, Jefsay to leave Forty Shillings was given to him by Nesh extraordinary, Also Richard Campell and John Long Senr. whom I like wise Constitute make and ordain the sole Executrix of this my Last will and Testa-

of May 1794
