ELIZABETH WOODWARD

In The Name Of God Amen, I Elizabeth Woodward of the district of fairfield and State of South Carolina, being Sick and weak of body, but of perfect Mind and Memory Calling to mind the mortality of my body and that is appointed of God for all men once to die, have thought proper to Make Constitute, and ordain this my last will and testament, First I Recommend my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the dust to be buried in a decent christian burial, And as to Such Worldly goods, and as to Such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to blefs me with in this life I mean to dispose of them as follows, VIZ. I allow all my Just debts to be paid out of My crop when finished and gathered in Also all the debts which My daughter Lucy Woodward has contracted previous to this date out of the Crop, Also I Give and bequeath unto My daughter Sarah Riley 1 Bay Horse, half of My Stock of Hogs, Also one half of whatever Remains of my Crop after the above debts is Paid and the Negroes is Supported until the Crop is finished Also the Whole of my Household furnature, with all my Cloathes except 2 beds & furniture, Also I give and bequath unto My Son Henry Woodward the remaining half of my stock of Hogs also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth McMorries ONE bed and furnature, Also I give and bequeath Unto My daughter Lucy Woodward one bed and all the furnature that She Now Claims And that I have given off to her Also as Much Corn and fodder as is Sufficient for one Horse, Then the Balance of my property I give and bequeath as follows, VIZ. When the Crop is finished, the remaining part of the Same with the property Not Mentioned Shall be Sold and be Equally divided between Benjamin Hay, Thomas

When the Crop is finished, the remaining part of the Same with the property Not Mentioned Shall be Sold and be Equally divided between Benjamin May, Thomas


May, Elizabeth McMorries, Jane Freeman, Lucy Woodward, Joseph Woodward and Henry Woodward, ONLY fifteen Dollars I will and bequeath to the Heirs of my Son Tho.^s Woodward lastly I do constitute ordain and appoint Josep Woodward An Executor, to this My last Will and testament, AND I do hereby Revoke, Disannul, and disallow all former Wills or testaments and do hereby declare this to be my last will and testament.
