And afterwards I give and devise all my Lands and Plantation whereon I now dwell containing three hundred acres to my two youngest Sons Ephriam and Thomas Tettipool, and after my said Wife decease o Widowhood I will that thes' Lands & plantation be rented out and the profit thereof to go to the use of my said Sons Sphriam and Thomas, and thes Eldest son Namely Sphriam not to have any command or pofession of thes Lands or any part thereof, until Thomas arrives to the Age of Twenty-two I give and bequeath to my Son William Pettipool one Segree Man named George to have Pofefsion of him as soon as he shall recover or get a Negree from James Hunt to the Value of Sixty Founds Sterling, and

for all Men once to die; do make and ordain this my Will and Testament: This is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the and of Almighty God that gave it, and Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in Christian decent Burial at the discretion of my executors. And afterwards I give and devise all my Lands and Plantation whereon I now dwell containing three hundred acres to my two youngest Sons Ephriam and Thomas ettivoolgoonneatineile decease o vidowhood I will that thes' Lands & plantation be rented out and the profit thereof to go to the use of my said Sons Sphriam and Thomas, and thes Eldest son Namely Sphriam not to have any command or pofession of thes Lands or any part thereof, until Thomas arrives to the Age of Twenty-two I give and bequeath to my Son William Pettipool one Negree Man named George to have Pofefsion of him as soon as he shall recover or get a Negree from James Hunt to the Value of Sixty Founds Sterling, and deliver it to his Mother -- I give and bequeath to my Son Abraham Pettipool two Negroes one Named Toney, the other named Lot. And all the rest of my Estate of Horses Cattle and Hogs, I will that they be sold after said Wife's decease and the money or profit arising benefron to be startly through along by four youngest

Daughters (Namely) Tabitha, Frances, Namny & Ursilla (Likewise the Houshold Furniture in the same manner.) --And that Negree which my Son William is to deliver to his Mother due from James Hunt I will that these Negroe (after thes Wother's decease) be sold and the Money arising therefrom be equally divided between m said two youngest Sons Ephriam and Thomas Pettipool. And lastly I do constitute and appoint my said Wife Executrix and my Son Abraham Pettipool Executor to this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal, the second Day of February, in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand seven Hundred and Ninety-three-Signed Sealed published pro-Ephriam Pettipool Seal Phoved Jan. 15, 1794 nounced and declared by the D Evans C.
