lity of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all
men ^{once} to die Do make and ordain this my last will and tes-
tament that is to say principally and first of all I give
and recomend my Soul int the han of Almighty God that gave
it and my body I Recommend to the earth to be buried in
deasent Christian burial at the discreation of my Exacu-
tors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I
shall recieve the same again by the mighty power of God
And as tuching such wourldly estate werewith it has pleas-
ed God to blefs me in this life I gave and dispose of the
same in the following manner and form.

And first I give and bequeath to my daughter Agnes
Florida child the lower end of my plantation which I
now live to be divided beginning at a hicory on the river
bank marked for that purpose running thence to a white
oak marked on the old line then taking the old line if
he does not live to the age of twenty one I do give and be-
queath to my daughter Mary his part with the upper end on
which the house stands with the house and all the household
furniture with the plantation tools also a negro boy and
girl named Mary and Fanny with one hundred Dollars also
two horses and four cow cows and all my hogs with what
she claims of her own property
And farther I do give and bequeath to my daughter Jean
one negro named Jacob and one hundred Dollars Also I
do give and bequeath to my daughter Elisabeth my plantation
lying on the south side of broad river containing one hun-
dred Acres and one hundred Dollars
Also I do give and bequeath to my two grand children Sarah and
Mary Bell two hundred Dollars each And farther if my daughter

Mary should depart this life without a lawfull heir I do give and bequeath the plantation and all bequeath to her to my two grand daughters Sarah and Mary Bell farther if they should both dy without lawfull ishew their peart shall be equally divided among my daughters of surviveing if not to their heirs Also the remainder of the stock is to be sold and equally divided among my three daughters Also my negro Bob is to remain on the plantation as long as Mary lives in a state of Salebacy and then to be sold and equally divided among my the daughters. Also I do give to William Feemster twenty two Dollars I do appoint and constitute Samuel Feemster and Adam Cooper and Samuel Jonson Executors to act and if the above will Exacuter inn witness whereof before the undersigned witnesses I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of september in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two
