GEORGE LEWEY

In the Name of God Amen I George Lewey of Fairfield County in the State of South Carolina being very Sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God Calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is Appointed for all men Once to die do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be Buried in decent Christian Burial at the Descretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the Genral Resurrection I shall receive the Same Again by the mighty power of God And as touching Such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to Blefs me with in this Life I give demise and dis use of the Same in the Will following 792-1795 and form First I give and Bequeath to Mary my bloved wife a certain Black horse called Buck, exclusive of any Sheare or Division to be her own Right and property,

Also I give to my well Beloved ^{Jon} George Fredrick Lewey One Hundred acres of Land Binding on Little River and On the Back of the Track of Land that I now Live on---

Also I give to my Beloved Son Henry Lewey One Hundred acres of Land in Sexinton ^{county} On a Branch of Broad River called Hollinsheds Creek Originally Grant,d to John Bater

Also I give to my Youngest Son Michel Lewey One Hundred and fifty Acres of Land joining Broad and Little Riverwith the whole Plantation-----

And as for my movable Estate my will is that it Shall be Sold and every Child have an Equal part I also constitute make and Ordain Mary Lewey and George Fredrick Lewey to be the Sole Executors of this my Last will and Testament and I do hereby Utterly disalow revoke

do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament that
is to say principlly and first of all I give and Recom-
mend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it
and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be Buried in
Decent Christian Burial at the Descretion of my Executors
nothing doubting but at the Genral Resurection I shall
receive the Same Again by the mighty power of God And
as to ching Such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleas-
ed God to Blefs me with in this Life I give demise and
dis ose of the Same in the following manner and form---
First I give and Bequeath to Mary my bloved wife a cer-

and disannul all and every Other former wills-----
