That is to say / FIRST. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mirabeth Ugeley and her Executors One Negro man named Henry, the Negro woman named Lucy and her Three Children named Toby Jane and Hector with their future Increase. AND the Plantation I now reside upon which I bought of Thomas Briggs Yarbrough lying on Taylor Creek containing six hundred thirty seven Acres and a half, AND all my Household Furniture with four Horses, four Cows and Calves and twenty Head of Hogs with their Increase. which said Furniture Horses, Cows and Calves, Hogs, Plantation and Negroes I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mirabeth Ugeley to the only use and behoof of the said Mirabeth Ugeley during her natural Life, and at her Decease the Horses, Cows and Calves Hogs, Negroes, with their Increase and Furniture to be equally divided between my Children then living. ITEM II. I give and bequeath to my beloved / Son Rowland Ugeley the Plantation on a terrace river containing Two Hundred and fifty Acres of Land joining Jonathan Ketton, also one other Plantation Containing

cease the Horses, Cows and Calves Hogs, Negros, with their
Increase and Furniture to be equally divided between my

Creek containing Two Hundred and fifty Acres of Land join-

But provided any of my Children should die before they arrive of Age, then the Property of those that are Dead to be equally divided between those that are in EXISTANCE ---

LASTLY I constitute and appoint my beloved brother Mathew Rugeley squire of Potton/ Bedfordshire in the Kingdom of Great Brittain Zachariah Centey Merchant in Camden, Nicholas Day Planter on ~~Waterce~~ and Mirabeth Rugeley my Beloved wife my lawful Executors and Executrix to this my last Will and Testament to which I have set my hand and seal this
