I Henry Ugeley of Fairfield County and State aforesaid being of sound and perfect Mind, Memory and Understanding good, do make, publish, pronounce and declare this to be and contain my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking, disallowing and annulling all last Wills and Testaments by me at any time hereto fore made and executed, and declaring this to be and contain my last Will and Testament. I do hereby recommend my Soul to God who gave it, and my Body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, and my Worldly Effects and Estates after payment and satisfaction of all my just Debts and funeral Expenses I give and bequeath as followeth/ That is to say/ I do give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mirabeth Ugeley the Negroes, Plantation and Estate which I bought of Thomas Briggs Yarbrough lying on Taylor Creek containing six hundred Thirty seven Acres and a half, all my Household Furniture with four Horses, four Cows and Calves, and twenty Head of Hogs with their Increase, which said Furniture Horses, Cows and Calves, Hogs, Plantation and Negroes I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mirabeth Ugeley to the only use and behoof of the said Mirabeth Ugeley during her natural Life, and at her Decease the Horses, Cows and Calves Hogs, Negroes, with their Increase and Furniture to be equally divided between my Children then living. I do give and bequeath to my beloved / Son Rowland Ugeley the Plantation on a terrace river containing Two Hundred and fifty Acres of Land joining Jonathan Ketton, also one other Plantation containing

at any time hereto fore made and executed, and declaring
this to be and contain my last Will and Testament. ~~ITEM~~ I

tation and Negros I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Mirabeth Rugeley to the only use and behoof of the said
Mirabeth Rugeley during her natural Life, and at her De-
cease the Horses, Cows and Calves Hogs, Negros, with their

beloved / Son Rowland Rugeley the Plantation on Wateree
River containing Two Hundred and fifty Acres of Land join-

hundred acres of land lying on Taylors Creek joining
the Plantation I now reside upon. which said Two Plantations
I give and bequeath unto the said Rowland Rugeley to him
and his heirs for Ever. ~~ITEM~~, I give and bequeath unto my
beloved Son Henry Rugeley and my beloved Son John Rugeley/
the three Plantations I purchased on Wateree Creek, adjoining
each other

and making together One Plantation containing Six Hundred and fifty Acres of Land, which said Plantation I wish and desire to be equally divided, and One half to be given to my Son Henry, and the other half to my Son John which saide ~~Two halves of the aforesaid~~ Plantation I give and bequeath to them and their Heirs for Ever. ~~ITEM~~ I give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Mary Ann Caroline Rugeley One Negro Wench named Sarah and her Two Children named Binah and Frank / with their future Increase. ALSO the Plantation on which I now ~~reside~~ after the Death of my Beloved wife Eliza-
 both Rugeley I will and be ueath -- unto my Daughter Mary Ann Caroline Rugeley which saide Negro Wench Sarah and her Two Children named Binah and Frank with their future Increase. and also the aforesaid Plantation on which I now
 reside and which I bought of Thos. ^SGreggs, Warbrough ~~which~~ I
 give and bequeath ^{Fairfield County Will Book 2, 1792-1795} ~~to my Daughter Mary Ann Caroline~~
 for ever, to the only use and behoof of the saide Mary Ann Caroline and/ the Heirs of her Body for Ever. THE REST of my Negroes, and Personale property I shall die possesst of my wish and request is that the Executors herein after mentioned will keep it together and carry on the Plantation until my Eldest Son Rowland attains the Age of Twenty One, then his share to be given him, and so on as they come of Age. But provided any of my Children should die before they arrive of Age, then the Property of those that are Dead to be equally divided between those that are in EXISTANCE ---
 LASTLY I constitute and appoint my beloved brother Mathew Rugeley squire of Potton/ Bedfordshire in the Kingdom of Great Brittain Zachariah Centey Merchant in Camden, Nicholas May Lantier on ~~Paterson~~ and Mirabeth Rugeley my Beloved wife my lawful Executors and Executrix to this my last Will and Testament to which I have set my hand and Seat this
