And as touching Such wordly Estate as hath been please God to blefs me with in this life, I give demise & dispose of the same in the following manner.

First I give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Woodward one Tract of Land two hundred & fifty acres wheron I now live Also four negroes named Jack, Milley, Sonny, and Jefse also lend to her one negro girl named rose during the natural life of my wife Elizabeth Woodward and after her death the afor Said negro rose With her offspring to be Equally divided between My Brother Thomas Deceased three Children to wit. Thomas Woodward, Elizabeth Woodward & Jofeph H. Woodward

I also give & bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Woodward all my Household firniture one horse called Silver heels & one called Dauben also all my Stock of Cattle two Sows XXX with pig & twelve of the best hogs in my Stock with all the corn and fodder on the place whereon I now live It is my will that all the rest of my property be Sold to pay my Just debts & Should there be a remnant it is my will my will my wife Elizabeth Woodward Shall have it.

ament and I likewise constitute and appoint my brother Joseph Woodward & William Morris Sen^r to be
