of April in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred  
And Seventy Three

County Fairfield May 9th 1791. Margaret Beasley wife & Exex  
of the within named Jacob Beasley being duly sworn made oath  
that the within paper now produced read & sworn to her is a  
true copy of her Husband's Will having heard the original  
read before it was lost that this copy was taken by Besy Mc-  
Mullahon who if since dead, she also gives up & disclaims her  
right of Administration in County Will Bk 1, 1787-1791
