I do hereby Give and bequeath unto My Son William Kincaid,

My Other lands adjoining Said plantation With all the
buildings I have thereon, both finished and those that are
Not. at present so to be finished on the Same plan they
were begun by Me, this to be done prior to any other part
of My Will, in the Same Manner and place I have laid off.

I leave and bequeath unto My Daughter Nancy Hall three hundred pounds Sterling of this state to be paid her for her Sole use and purpose, which She is to have the Whole Disposal of and the Remainder of the Said Sales before described I leave and bequeath in the Manner following. That is to Say after the Said Nancy Hall is paid three hundred pounds, I Allow the Residue of Said AMount of Sales to be divided into four Equal parts, ~~and be given~~ Each part to My four Daughters hereafter Mentioned that is to Say Mary Kincaid, Margaret Kincaid, Elizabeth Kincaid, & Rebeckath Kincaid, to have and have and Share alike and further it is My Wish that My Said Daughters above Mentioned, do live on Said plantation which I have left William Kincaid, and that the Interest of Each ones dividend do go towards Supporting of them and what ever part of Said Interest is Necessary* UNto they are Married or removed Otherwise - Lastly I do hereby Nominate Constitute and ap- M^r. William Kincaid My Son to be My Executor and My loving Wife Mary Kincaid to be My Executrix of this My last Will and testament hereby revoking all other ~~and~~ former Wills by me Made and declaring this only to be my last Will, In Witnefs whereof I The Said James Kincaid, have to this My Said Will Set My hand and Seal this the twentieth day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and One and in the twenty Sixth Year of the Sovereignty and Independance of the UNITED States of America.-----
