second. I nominate & appoint my true & trusty friend John Bell Executor & my Dear wife Phebe, aforesaid Executor--- To this my last will & Testament, revoking & disannulling all other Wills. That might have been heretofore made by me. & do declare This only to be my real, Will. & Testament In witness-----whereof I have hereunto Set my hand & Seal this Ninetienth day of May in the Year of our Lord one Thousand Seven hundred & Ninety Nine.
