the feeding of two Cows Yearly during her life but if

any of these my two oldest Sons should Chuse to withdraw

their Claim and would rather have a third payed payed in

then he that holds shall pay him that withdraws one third

part of the Value so that he that holds the land shall

only Anjoy a third part and be obliged to Continue the Same

provisions to my wife ^{as above} in respect of my moveable ~~to be~~

property whatever may be move or lefs at my Wifes death
or the marriage of my sons it shall be divided thus one
