John & Joseph Camron & John and Margret R^c Ewen, I also give and— bequeath to my loving wife Jean Camron a Tract of Land Called Ewinges and also Sixty Seven Acres adjoining the same, to be bequeathed at her Difease at her pleasure Any more than the firft Child that said Negro wench may have shall refer to my Son Joseph Camron; if he has a lawful Heir at his De—eafe if not if not to be


