and Touching such worldly Estates as it hath pleased God to
Bless me with I give demise and Dispose of the Same in the
following Manner & form VIZ. I give & bequeth unto my Beloved
Wife the Mare- named Cato & two Cows & Calfs at her Chusing
out of the pferasant Stock of Cattle also A the Boat bed a shelf
& Cupboard furniture Saw puter Delph &c - - -

also I Leave unto my Brother Robert five pounds to be paid
in one year after my Death and also I Leave him my wearing
Apperall or Clothing I also Leave unto Andrew M^o-Petters five
pounds and it is My Desire that All my property except what
is left as above be sold in the month of November next after
my death at on A Credit & deal as may be thought best by my
Executers and the whole Balance after paying my Just Debts
to be Devided into three Equal Shares betwixt my Beloved

Wife and my Brother Roberts two Sons William & John Ewings
Turn over
and I make and Ordain my Nephew William Ewing-- & James Barber
my Executers of this my last Will & Testament in trust for the
intent & purpose in this my Will Contained-- to take Care &
see the Same performed according to my True Intent & Meaning
in itnefs--whereof I. the said William Ewing have to this
my last will & Testament set my hand and seal the day &
