I Robert Thorpe of Granville County in the Province of South  
Carolina Gentleman send Greeting Whereas a certain Negroe  
Woman <sup>commonly</sup> called or known by the name <sup>Tula</sup> July is my pure  
perfect and absolute Slave And Whereas her child called  
and known by the name Bob otherwise Robert was born of the  
aforesaid Negroe Woman <sup>Tula</sup> July in pure perfect and absolute  
Slavery And Whereas the said Negroe Woman named <sup>Tula</sup> July  
and her said Child now is and has been known reputed deemed  
and taken to be the pure perfect and absolute Slave of the said  
Robert Thorpe Now know Yll That I the said Robert Thorpe  
for diverse good causes and considerations me thereunto moving  
HAVE for my self my heirs Executors and Administrators  
manumised enfranchised and set <sup>at</sup> liberty And by these presents  
Do manumise enfranchise and set at liberty the said Negroe  
Woman named <sup>Tula</sup> July and her said Child named Bob otherwise  
Robert with all their sequel issue or progeny gotten or to be  
begotten do from the yoke of Slavery forever deliver and  
discharge And all and singular their lands tenements goods  
or Chattles which they or either of them have or hereafter may  
have get or acquire And further KNOW Yll that  
I the said Robert Thorpe have remised released and for me my  
heirs Executors and Administrators have for ever quit claimed and  
do by these presents remise release and for me my heirs executors  
and administrators for ever quit claim unto the said Negroe woman  
<sup>Tula</sup> July and to her said child Bob otherwise Robert and to her  
and his heirs sequel and progeny gotten or to be begotten all  
and all manner of actions real and personal suits quarrels  
services trespasses debts and demands whatsoever where-

then and there manumise enfranchise and set free the said  
July and her said child Robert with all their sequel and progeny  
gotten or to be begotten from thenceforth of the yoke of Slavery  
and Bondage thereby forever delivering and ~~defending~~<sup>discharging</sup> the  
said July and Robert the which said instrument of Freedom  
on the seventeenth day of November following in the same year  
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty one was  
duly proved and recorded in the Secretary's office of that  
Province relation being thereunto had may fully appear.  
Now know ye that the said black woman named July being  
discharged from Slavery and free from Bondage as aforesaid  
leath with her son Bob from the said fifteenth day of November  
one Thousand seven hundred and forty one to the day of the  
date of these presents remained free from Bondage as aforesaid  
and have ever since been deemed as free people And we do further  
certify that within the space of Thirty years last past the said  
July hath had several other children besides the said Robt  
as hereafter mentioned and first one Daughter called Amey  
since deceased who before her death bare a Son called Cupid  
which boy is now living the other children of the said July  
which are now living are named as followeth one Negro man  
named Jack another called Abraham also a Girl called Rose  
Given under our hands and seals upon faint Mary's River  
the Thirtieth day of March One Thousand seven hundred  
and seventy three

To All Persons To whom these Presents may come be seen or made known  
I do certify that on the sixteenth day of November in the year  
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty one and the  
fifteenth year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the second  
Robert Thorpe of Granville County in the Province of South Carolina  
Gentleman did under his hand and seal by form instrument of writing  
for diverse causes and considerations him thereunto moving for  
himself his heirs executors and administrators a certain black woman  
called or known by the name of <sup>Tafa</sup> Juley and her Mulatto son called Bob  
or Robert then being known reputed and taken to be the absolute  
Slaves of the said Robert Thorpe He the said Robert Thorpe did

the said Robert Thorpe or my heirs executors or administrators  
had have or shall or may hereafter have or claim against the  
said Negroe woman named <sup>Tula</sup> or her said child named  
Bob otherwise Robert or against her or his heirs executors  
or administrators by reason of the Slavery or servitude aforesaid  
or for any other matter cause pretence or colour whatsoever from  
the beginning of the World to the day of the date of these  
presents so that neither I the said Robert Thorpe nor my  
heirs executors or Administrators nor any other by me or for  
me or in my name shall or may from henceforth have exact-  
sue claim or challenge any manner of right use action  
Interest or demand of Slavery servitude or bondage against  
the said Negroe Woman <sup>Tula</sup> or her said Child Bob otherwise  
Robert or her or his heirs sequel or progeny goods chattels  
lands or tenements or any of them by any ways or means  
whatsoever but shall be thereof for ever excluded and debarred  
by virtue of these presents and I the said Robert Thorpe and  
my heirs executors and administrators the said Negroe woman  
named <sup>Tula</sup> and her said child Bob otherwise Robert with  
her and his sequel and progeny gotten and to be begotten  
against all people shall and will warrant and forever defen-  
d in witness whereof I the said Robert Thorpe have to the  
presents set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of  
November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred  
and forty one and in the fifteenth year of the Reign of George  
the second King over Great Britain, &c.
