JOHN COLLINS

The following last will & testament of John Collins was presented in open court October term 1792 and ordered to be recorded which was done this 15th January 1793.

In the name of God, Amen the 8th day of June, 1792 I John Collins of the County of Greenville and State of South

Carolina being verry sick & weak of body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God. I give and bequeath

shilling; I give to my son William Collins the sum of ten dollars; 3 I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Collins the sum of ten dollars; 4th. I give & be weath to my son John Collins the mare & fold that the mare had this

spring that is called phenis; 5th I rive and allow my plantation & stock both of horses & cows & all other stock & working tools of all sort that I have and every thing belonging to me, except what is above mentioned is to go to the mastainance of my wife and raising of my children and at my wife's death, what remains equally to be divided among my children, that is small & not mentioned by name but my

son Abner is to have the land and his shear of the rest, signed sealed & delivered b the said John Collins as his last will & testament.
