JAMES FORRESTER

At a court began and held for May term 1791 the following  
last will and testament of James Forrester was presented  
into open court and proven by the oaths of William Bradley  
and Ede Johnson and ordered to be recorded which was done  
this 28th day of May, 1791.

In the name of God Amen I James Forrister of Greenville  
County in the state of South Carolina being in his perfect  
senses tho frail in body blessed be God do this the fourth  
day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hund-  
red and ninety do make and publish this my last will and  
testament in the manner following that is to say first I give  
& bequeath to my loving wife Elizabeth my plantation whereon  
I now live and my household furniture & creatures & cattle  
& hogs & working tools during her life time then all the  
moovable estate to fall to my loving son Hardy Forrister &  
the land and plantation to my loving son Richard Forrister  
the land containing one hundred and Sixty nine acres. I give  
and bequeath to my loving son John Forrister my plantation  
on Duck creek containing two hundred acres of land and I  
hereby make and ordain Joseph O Bannon and Hardy Forrister  
executors of this my last will and testament in witness  
whereof I the said James Forrester have to this my last will  
and testament set my hand and the day and year above written.  
Signed sealed published and declared by the said, James  
Forrester the testator as his last will and testament in the  
presence of us who are present at the time of signing and seal-  
ing thereof.
