named Rachel one girl named Tiller one named Dilly & one boy named Isom which I have given her in possession also one bed & furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto Thomas Vadsworth Elkin son of my daughter Polly one negro girl named Alse and one named Darcas and one boy named Anderson also one bed & which my said daughter Polly

one boy named have at her death and if the said Thomas Tadsworth had in her possession at her death and if the said Thomas Tadsworth should die without lawful issue his part of my estate to be equally should die without lawful issue his part of my estate to be equally

Billy child of Jude also my land and plantation whereon I now live (only my wife to have the use of the land during her natural life)

also one sorrel filly one featherhed ad furniture to him whisheirs forever. Item. I lend unto my beloved and lawful wife Mary all my land and plantationwhereon I now live with all the plantations tools and

after my just debts is paid out of my stock of corn or other moveable property as my executors may think can be spared best also I lend her during her natural life one nagro man named Hall one Jim one girl named Chany after the death of my wife my will & desire that my land and plantation stock of hogs & one cubbord two walnut tables be my son Davis, the rest of my property to be sold and equally divided between all my living children but if my wife should decease soon after my decease or before my younger children become of

household furniture and stock and corn and meat that is on the place

with my elder children as to schooling and other small matters also my will a desire is that if any of my children dies without lawful issue that their part of my estate be equally divided amongst the rest of my surviving children and I do hereby appoint my friend Phil Bradford my son James Bunt and Dyer Tally executors of this my last

age I wish my younger to be dealt with as nearly as may be equally
