In the name of God Amen I john engetsa of South Carolina an worthy member of the Church being through the a undant morey and goodness of God tho weak in body yet of a sound and perfect understanding and memory do con titute this my last will and testament and desirest may be received by all as such imprimes. I most humbly bequeath my soul to God my maker beseeching his most / radious acceptance of it through the all sufficient merits and mediation of my most compassionate redeemer Jesus Christ who wave himself to be an attonment for my sins and is able to save to the uttermost all that come unto God by him seeing he ever iveth to make intercession for them and who I trust will not reject me a returning penitent ainner when I come to him for mercy in this nope and confidence I tender up y soul with comfort numbity beseeching the most blested and glorious Trinity one God most Holy most merciful and Glorious to prepare me for the time of my disolution and then to take me to himself in that peace and rest and incomparable felinity which he has prepared for all that love and hear his noly name Amen. Itema ! give to my son James one negro named Harry to him and his heirs, Item I give to my son Solomon one negro named Lamkin to him and his heirs, Item I give to my grandson Asa at marriage if he lives until then, if not to his brother  $^{ ext{m}}_{11}$  but my wife to have the use of him her life and after

negro named Benn, I also give Jechonias that piece of land he lives on to him and his heirs, Item I give to my daughter Molley Smith one negro named Venus, but if Feb brings one more for that to go to golley and Venus to fall to her mistress, Item I give to my daughter Beekka Will one negro girl named Ede to her and her heirs after my wife's decess Item I give to my daughter Fanney my negro boy named Tim. Item I give to my daughter Salley Smit. one negro boy named Lister, Item to my son famuel one negro man named .ippoh after my wife's decease, Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Spanness / cow & calf, Item 1 rive to my two sons Joseph Jesse ten smillings sterling each also my daughter Patta MoVay the same Item I leave the rem inder of my whole estate land and mill and il my household cods and the use of all the negroes but Linkin and Harry during her life and after her decease to be sold at Vendee, the land and mill and all the estate indow and all to be divided amon, at my children named as followeth & first Samuel Langston, Molley Smith, Sally Smith & Fanny Languton, Jechonias Langston and John son of Jesse

Followeth & first Samuel Langston, Molley Smith, Sally Smith & Fanny Languton, Jechonias Langston and John son of Jesse my grandson equal to be divided among them all & Beckka illims. I also constitute ordain this to be my last will and testament revising and disamuling every will & wills made by me heretofore and I appoint my son Jechonias and my son-in-law Thos Williams to be my full and sole executors of this my last will & testament, I forgot Lusia Trompson to give her two dollars silver and I hereunto set my hand and seal this

first day of March in the year of our bord 1782.
