In the name of God, Amen, I Lewis Pike of the State of State of South Carolina Greenville District being in health and of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my body and Knowing that it is appointed for all men once to to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend my soul into the hands of the Almighty God that give it, and my body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Exe'rs. nothing Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall Receive the same by the mighty Power of God and as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in with in this life I give Demise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

Item the first I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Pike all my Estate Real and personal during her life and at her Death to Dispose of as she pleases.

I also give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Mary Pike two beds and furniture one chist and table and two Chairs and one wheel now in her possision to her and her heirs for Ever to be posed of I also constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary Pike and my Trusty friend Matthew Hudson the sole Exec'rs. of this my last Will and Testament as Witness whereof I have herouno set my hand and seal this 11th day of March 1817.
