Item the first I give and Disting and requesth to my beloved wife Mary Pike all my Estate Real and personal dureing her life and at her Death to Dispose of as she pleases.

I also give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Mary Fike two beds and furnture one chist and table and two Chairs and one wheel now in her possision to her and her heirs for Ever to be possed of I also constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary Fike and my Trusty friend Matthew Hudson the sole Exec'rs, of this my last will and Tostament as Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this lith day of March 1817.
