First, I give my soul to almighty God who first gave it to me and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors, and as to my worldly estate the Lord has pleased to bless me with I give and desire in manner as follows.

Item 1st, I bequenth unto my wife Pelly Dill my tract of land containing of one hundred and fifty acres her lifetime and also I becueath unto her all my ready money and also my stock of hogs also my stock of cattle also mare and geg and also my stock of shoop and also two feather bods and their clothing; I also becueath unto her a negro boy named Meps her lifetime, and I also bequeath unto her a negro woman named Mint her life time and at her decease she is to live with them that treat her bost! This becueath and will unto my beloved wife Polly Dill as above named. Item 2nd, It is my will and desire that my son Charles that I bequeath unto him one hundred dellars out of my estate. Item 3rd, It my will and desire that my son Escas that I bequeat unto him one hundred and twenty-five dellars out of my estate.

Item 4. It is my will and desire that my sem Jefferson
that I becomest unto him one hundred dollars out of my estate.
Item 5. Is my desire that my describer Frankey Renson that
I bequeath unto her one hundred dollars out of my
Item 6. The my desire that daughter Polly Hemson that I
be useth unto her one hundred dellars out of my estate after
these three some and two daughters receive the above named
some they are equal with the rest and after the property is
call and debts paid they come in for an equal share with

the rest.

Item V. It is my will and desire that I bequeath unto my seem George Dill one negre bey nemed Rubin and also one Clay bank colte

Hem 8. It my will and desire that I bequeath unto my
Benjamin F. Dill one negro boy named Zed and also one horsecelt with these two some George and Benjamin receive the
above named property they have received their part and
portion of my estate all the rest of my property to be
sold and equally divided byteen the rest of my children.

I hereby appoint my wife Polly Dill and my son Elyah
Dill to my executor to manage my estate agreeable to how both
of them whom I put my trist confidence in to manage my
estate as executors to carry this will into execution.
