

WILLIAM PEDEN of Greenville District, South Carolina.
Wife: Molly. Sons: Robert, Dan and Alexander. Daughters: Peggy,
Isabella and Mary. Son-in-law: David Peden. Wife to receive her
choice of two negroes and horses, all kitchen furniture and her
support off the plantation. All negroes including those now in the
possession of son Robert and daughter Peggy are to be appraised and
equally divided among the six children. The plantation to remain
the home of wife and four youngest children while they are single.
After youngest son Alexander becomes twenty one plantation may be
divided between sons Dan and Alexander, but it is to remain the
home for wife for her lifetime and two youngest daughters until
their marriage. A horse values at \$75.00 to each of my two youngest
sons and two youngest daughters. Household furniture to be divided
between wife, two youngest sons and two youngest daughters. Land
which son Robert has is valued at \$550.00 and is to be considered
a part of his share.
